STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

St John's was reopened in 2010 as a church plant from Holy Trinity Brompton and St Stephen's Twickenham by the Bishops of London and Kensington, in consultation with the then Parish Vicar, The Rev'd David Lund, the Hampton Deanery and the Kensington Area Council. The legal and organisational umbrella for this ministry was the charity known as The Mission Community of St John's Kingston Bridge. On the 1st May 2017 a new Parish was established within the structures of the Church of England, by redividing the Parish between St Mark's Teddington and St John's Hampton Wick. The new Parish is called St John the Baptist, Hampton Wick and assets, certain liabilities and employees were transferred legally on 1st January 2019 to the new Parish from The Mission Community of St John's Kingston Bridge.

The church is managed by the Clergy and Parochial Church Council (PCC), under the authority of the Archdeacon of Middlesex and the Bishop of Kensington.

Connect groups play a vital role at St John's. They are at the heart of our community, helping people to Love Jesus, Build Community, and Transform Lives. It has been a joy to see more leaders step forward to run new groups and existing groups continuing to multiply.

SJC is a vital part of our church community. Our vision is to provide every child with the opportunity to grow and develop their own faith by helping them understand how loved they are by God and encouraging them to have a personal relationship with Him. We welcome all children aged 0-11 to join our 3 SJC groups that meet every Sunday morning at 9 am and 10.30 am. We are currently on a four-year curriculum that allows the children to continue to grow in their faith and explore more about it.

Last year, we hosted a Light Party, our alternative to Halloween, which attracted more than 140 children and their families to the church. We also held several services, including a Christingle Service (attended by 120), Crib Service (attended by 230) and Interactive Good Friday Service - attended by 110 people.

For the past two years, we have been running a monthly family service called Jump for Joy. This lively service includes exciting activities such as worship songs, crafts, drama stories, challenges, and bible teachings. We have received great feedback from both parents and children, and we feel honoured to offer this service to our families, with an average attendance of 50-60 children and their families per session.

At SJC, we enjoy worshipping with our worship assistant, Ezra, who has introduced a fresh monthly pattern for leading worship in the Warehouse.

Our relationship with both local schools continues to grow, and we enjoyed visits from Hampton Wick Infant School, as well as Christmas and Easter Assemblies with St John the Baptist Junior School. We continue to regularly lead assemblies at both schools, where they are always pleased to see us.

As ever, our ministry wouldn't run without our amazing team of interns and volunteers who help to make everything we do possible.

We had our youth weekend away in February with the theme being 'regathering' as we began to return to normal life following the lockdowns.

Later in February we said goodbye to EJ as she stepped down from the youth team. We give thanks for EJ and all that she bought to St John's Youth. As EJ stepped down, we welcomed Ezra onto the youth team. Ezra would regularly oversee youth band nights as well as playing a key role in leading Older Youth lads.

In the Spring term, Older Youth regathered over a number of socials! We enjoyed trips to bowling, Nando's, more bowling and Pizza Express just to name a few! These socials gave Older Youth a chance to relax, to gather and pray, as well as enjoying each others company before exam season began

The summer brought more new beginnings as we launched both Broadcast & Roots Cafe, all in the space of a week!

Broadcast is our termly worship/outreach evening. In September we were joined by 9 other churches as we 'broadcast' the Good News to more than 60 young people.

Roots Cafe has grown and grown over the past few months, you could say it's roots are fully planted! We are delighted to welcome 20+ young people each Monday afternoon, providing a safe, warm and welcoming place for them to hang out and experience God's love through the actions and words of the wonderful team. 75% of those attending have not been to church before. On the back of opening Roots, we began Youth Alpha in November, attended by 20-25 young people, some from Roots and some from St John's Youth. We're excited to be re-launching Youth Alpha again in Spring 2023, alongside St Mary's East Molesey.

My highlights from the year have been the continued growth of youth attendance on Sunday mornings and Friday Night's, seeing young people living out our core values, as well as inviting friends at every opportunity, a number of young people being both baptised and confirmed, the launch of Broadcast, the launch of Roots and the youth team growing again after the pandemic.

I would like to thank all the amazing parents & guardians of all our wonderful young people. Thank you for all their love and support towards myself and the team.

Thank you also to our great Youth Team who have been a a huge support to myself, and to the young people. They serve with such willing hearts, with such love and energy! The young people are very blessed that you are willing to give and share so powerfully. Thank you also to everyone who continues to pray for this wonderful youth ministry!

The student ministry has grown from strength to strength with more and more students discovering and rediscovering the love of Jesus, alongside a growing passion for evangelism, worship and the Bible. Becca Rimmer joined the student team in January 2022 and after a term in the Warehouse, we moved Student Nights to Becca's flat, continuing to explore the Identity Course. Our prayer was that Thursday Student Nights would be a place of home, belonging and family for the students, especially with so many international students. With a small but committed core group, we saw the students form deep friendships with one another as we met together for worship and socials, as well as running Open Mic nights together and praying around the campuses. Students have found a home at the 6pm service, sitting together each week but also serving on team. Freshers week was lots of fun, with stands at Kingston and St Mary's freshers' fairs and a guided tour of Kingston plus endless pizza-giveaways, we connected and prayed with tonnes of students, inviting them to come along to try church. Autumn term was a key time for welcoming students exploring faith (a highlight was Neeraj's baptism), outreach and sharing vision. Having outgrown Becca's flat, we moved Student Night the Church where we grew and grew as students invited their friends. Our vision and heart for this academic year is to meet God in PEWS (Prayer, Encounter, Worship, Scripture)! The team continues to form links with the university and the Christian Unions as well as other churches, connecting with and offering to pray for students around the campuses as well as meeting up with students 1 to 1.

YOUNG ADULTS

In 2022, St John's Young Adults' ministry simply exploded! Each week at our 6pm service more and more men and women in their 20s and 30s kept coming along, finding community and falling in love with Jesus. Invited by friends at the gym and at work, passing by at just the right time or finding us online, they came and we loved them. Our 'Summer of Rest and Joy' programme saw Young Adults worshipping together at Focus and David's Tent festivals, as well as Art Night at Becca's, a Nature Retreat in Bushy Park, Outdoor Movie Night, Games and Sports Nights and a day trip to Brighton. By September deep friendships had formed and the Young Adults had their own identity as a core part of the St John's Church community. We already had one YA Connect Group, but when Marika, Nay and Becca started another in September, 25 people signed up the first week! By Christmas we had 30+ and had already started meeting in two homes, ready to multiply in 2023. Our heart as a YA and 6PM team is to raise up mature disciples, leaders in every sphere of society, disciple-makers who are always ready to share their faith. Our Young Adults are passionate for Jesus, for welcome, for community, for serving and for fun and we're so excited for all God has in store as they continue to invite their friends to come and meet Jesus.

FABRIC REPORT

Church

During 2022 there were no major repairs or changes to the building nor its fabric.

The most important input was the 5 yearly independent Quinquennial Inspection which identified a few significant items needing attention and repairs. These included the need to replace the notice boards and redecorate the church doors, reset some of the paving slabs on the front area and repairs to the office area roofing. All of these are either completed or planned for 2023.

The major items of expenditure were:

Roof repairs - £888.00 Inspections and follow-up action for Quinquennial Inspection - £1,021.00 Replacement of dishwasher - £370.00

The other items making up the total were for routine items.

The total spend on maintenance in 2022 was £5,565.00.

Warehouse

The Warehouse did not require any major works. The usage and rental receipts were £28,760.00

The total spend on maintenance in 2022 was £3,925.00.


- Delivering a total of 8 full courses and 16 individual workshop sessions



SAFEGUARDING REPORT

The Church Safeguarding Officer is responsible for ensuring the coordination of any concerns about a child, young person or vulnerable adult, or the behaviour of an adult working with vulnerable groups. Their role is to ensure that these are appropriately reported both to the statutory agencies and to the Diocesan Safeguarding Team. They attend the PCC each year and work with them to ensure the proper implementation of our safeguarding policy.

SAFER RECRUITMENT

It is our intention that that no one starts a paid or voluntary role with children, young people or vulnerable adults before they have been interviewed, given a role description, their DBS is processed and clear, references received, confidential declaration completed and code of conduct and volunteer agreement signed.

Responsibility:

Penny Miller (St John's Safeguarding Office/Operations Director) is responsible for HR and the recruitment process for employees, and if the role requires it, they are taken through a DBS process. For volunteers for SJC and Youth, the job is shared between the Youth Pastor, SJC Co-ordinator and Safeguarding Officer. Potential volunteers are interviewed and given a role description and then taken through the DBS process and references gained.

SAFEGUARDING TRAINING

The Church of England has produced a basic level e-learning safeguarding training tool, which we ask all volunteers and staff and PCC to do every 3 years.

RAISING AWARENESS AND DEVELOPING A SAFER CULTURE

It is important for everyone to know what to do in the case of a concern arising. A copy of our safeguarding policy is permanently affixed to the Welcome Desk. We also have posters on the toilet doors in the Warehouse and Church which show who adults and children with concerns should go to.

Awareness of safeguarding is also raised in prayer ministry training, from the point of view of what to do if someone makes a disclosure while asking for prayer.

Most safeguarding concerns are generally brought to a member of staff and they know to go to the Vicar or Penny Miller and the process works well. When necessary, concerns are also raised with the Diocesan Safeguarding Team and Agreements put in place.

Claire Stevens is our Children's Champion.

Steven Bryan (Churchwarden) adds a depth of church and legal experience to our team. Steve is a Partner at law firm Paul Hastings LLP and has served on the PCC at St Stephen's Twickenham.
